

that were there were up for auction and sold. We don't have actual figures yet but the green house sold for about \$2300 and the shed sold for about \$1300. Work on the irrigation at the park will start in the next couple of weeks and it will get seeded so around June of next year we can plan an open house/ribbon cutting ceremony. The Fire department needed some new landscaping around the flag pole and we worked to get it done similar to what was done at City Hall. Harrison Park is getting the basketball court replaced, we have the rim and backboard up and we are getting ready to pour the concrete pad. Minor pruning of trees along Main Street has been done. Our trim mower is in and we have a new employee, Del Martinez. He was one of our seasonal employees. Tennille asked where the funds from the green house and shed would be going and Dennis indicated that it goes back into the general fund.

Item #3 Skateboard Park Rule Review

Dennis reviewed his report in regards to the survey of surrounding areas on their rules for their skate parks. There was much discussion following. It was indicated that there was a level of learning the rules of the skate park and skate etiquette to be observed. The park was designed specifically for skate boarders and that perhaps we could expand the park to accommodate the scooters and bikes. It was also mentioned about regulating the park and that it is not our responsibility to regulate the park. The skate board association did the work and put in the effort to get the park built. They have ownership in the park, none of the other users have come forward to get together to enhance or extend the park for their use. Staff indicated that the park was not designed for bikes. Scooters and bikes can damage the surface of the skate park. Chairman Dane asked for a motion or recommendation.

Ryan Horsley motioned that we make a recommendation to the City Council that the skate board park be for skate boards only. Tennille Adams seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken and the results are:

The motion failed with a tied vote.

Tennille Adams moved to accept the Parks In Lieu of Application. Motion was seconded by Ryan Horsley. Motion passed with a unanimous vote.

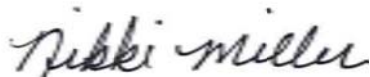
Item #5 Other Items from the Commission.

Monday night is the public hearing on the City budget. It is open for people to speak in regards to the budget. Some items that we asked for we did not get but we are funded to do a Master Plan for Parks and Recreation. We are getting the normal equipment and maintenance items, some of the projects are a shelter for Ascension, electricity at the Frontier Field shelters, a restroom for the Blue Lakes Rotary Park and this weekend they are getting their swing sets and money is being raised for the shelter, and we will get the bathroom is next year. We are also looking at some new scoreboards at Oregon Trail Youth Complex. We will be pouring concrete shaped like a baseball (with the threads) and installing some picnic tables with some safety netting in the space where the old restrooms and concession stand were located.

This year's budget is almost completed. Dennis is working on the Community Entrance signs and maintenance on one of canyon rim trails by adding a sand slurry and the trim mower has been received. We will be doing some paving at two of our most popular parks parking lots, Oregon Trail Youth Complex and Harmon Park at the skate park side. The Golf Course overflow will also be done. All three will be done using the double chip seal method. Hopefully we will have this done by the end of September. The funding is coming from the Auger Falls trails project as those projects could not be done due to the construction. Tennille asked about the Evel Knievel, Shoshone Falls and Dierkes Lake project status. The Evel Knievel project did not get approved. The Shoshone Falls and Dierkes Lake project had a subcommittee and their recommendations for the interpretative signs at the Kiwanis nook and the old ferry were submitted. We also talked about getting some power at some of the tables at Shoshone Falls.

Meeting was adjourned at 12:45. Next meeting is September 10, 2013 at the City Council Chambers, 305 Third Ave East at 11:30 am.
